Dr. Pope is a member of the New York Society for Ethical Culture. Since 2010, Dr. Pope has served as President of the National Ethical Service (NES), a United Nations Non-Governmental Organization (NGO). In collaboration with the NES executive committee, Dr. Pope is responsible for the overall implementation of NES's mission. She is also the NES representative to the United Nations. At the UN she participates on the Committee on Human Rights and Subcommittee to End Racism and Xenophobia. NES is an affiliate of the American Ethical Union.



Dr. Pope is Professor Emerita in Political Science at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey. She received her Bachelor of Arts from Brooklyn College and Masters of Arts from Queens College, of the City University of New York system. She earned her Doctor of Philosophy in Urban Planning from Columbia University's Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation. Dr. Pope's publications include articles, essays and two often-cited books; *Biting The Hand That Feeds Them* and *Bounty Hunters, Marshals and Sheriffs*. A staunch supporter of cities, urban social planning has framed her career of scholarship, teaching, advocacy; each informed by extensive global travels.
